NKS in short



NKS (Nordic Nuclear Safety Research) is a forum for Nordic cooperation, networking and competence maintenance/building in nuclear safety, including emergency preparedness.

NKS runs joint activities of interest to financing organizations and other end users producing seminars, exercises, scientific articles, technical reports and other types of reference material.

Two Programmes running activities: NKS-R (nuclear reactor safety, etc.) and NKS-B (nuclear/radiological emergency preparedness, etc.)

Results should be practical and directly applicable for use by participating organizations in their decision making processes and information activities.

Financing and support comes from Nordic authorities, companies and other organizations. Annual call for proposals (mid October)

Requirements to receive NKS funding:


- Nordic collaboration, R: minimum of 2 Nordic countries involved;
 B: minimum of 3 Nordic countries involved.
- Organizations from non-Nordic countries welcome with own funding
- Project costs, NKS funding maximum of 50 % of the total cost of the project other 50 % from other sources.
- NKS funding is granted for one project year at a time.
- Maximum funding from NKS per year per project ~ 600 kDKK
- In recent years NKS-R has typically funded 6 proposals/year and NKS-B has typically funded 7-8 proposals/year.
- Primary project deliverable is a project report essentially covering all work carried out. All reports are available cost-free at www.nks.org.

- Decommissioning and management of nuclear waste
- Severe Accidents
- Reactor Physics
- Plant life management and extension
- Organisational issues and Safety culture
- Thermal hydraulics
- Risk analysis and probabilistic methods



NKS-B Program: work areas and funding




Three program areas:




NKS warmly welcomes proposals from you for new R&D activities

Call for Proposals 2026

The NKS invites proposals for activities to be partially supported (up to 50% of total cost) in 2026 from an expected budget of 3 million DKK. No specific priorities have been identified with this call, but proposals must address at least one of the research areas as described in the NKS-B part of the NKS framework document. Information regarding the NKS framework as well as instructions for applicants and application forms can be found via the links below. Please take the time to read the instructions to applicants carefully so it is clear to you what is expected from applicants by NKS in terms of information to be provided in the application form and the reporting of output from the activity.

Please note that we have two different proposal forms: one for application for new activities, and one for application for continuation of running activities. For any additional information please contact the NKS-B Programme Manager Kasper Andersson.

NKS Board meeting decides the NKS-B activity funding for 2026 based on the assessments of the evaluators and the proposal of the Programme Manager. Successful applicants will be contacted immediately after the decision of the NKS Board.




NKS and young professionals
